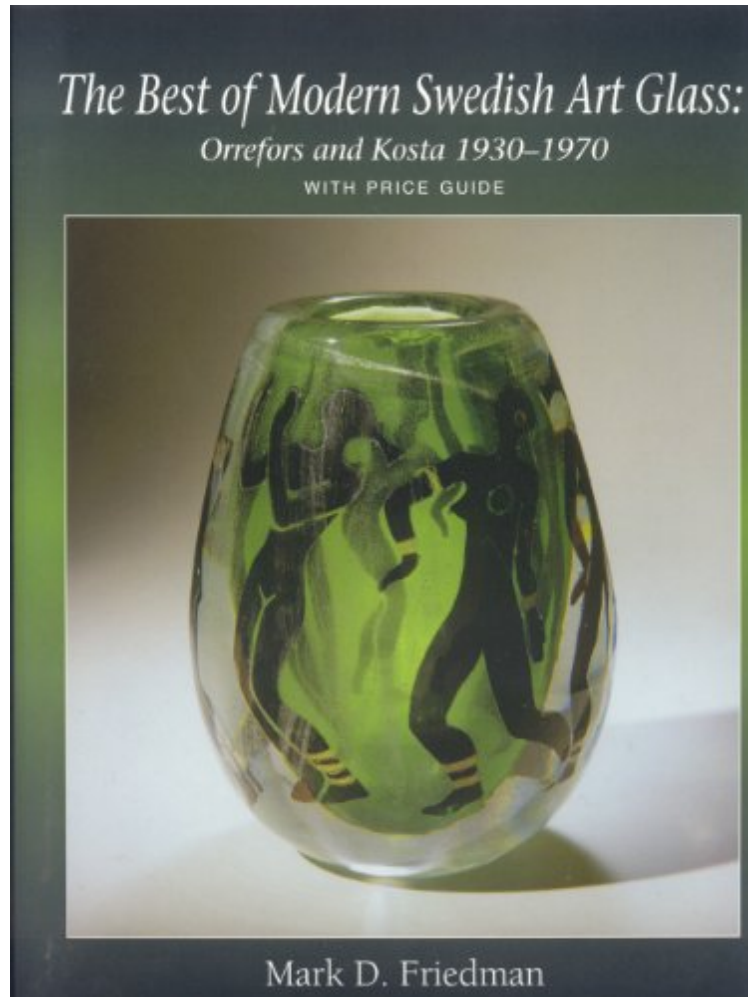

All these designers didn't create vases considered as master pieces. I thought that this book was a review of all their work starting with simple vases up to master piece in order to have an overview on the range of prices, the vase quality and techniques. A new collector as I'm can't afford to spend 30,000 dollars on a Graal or

Ariel vase for the first purchase. I think that many prior steps must be completed before to start buying Scandinavian art glass master pieces.2- all the technics of creation like Ariel, Graal or others technics are not well explained so that I had to go on the net to have more explanations.Positive points:The history of the Orrefore Kosta manufactures is well described.
