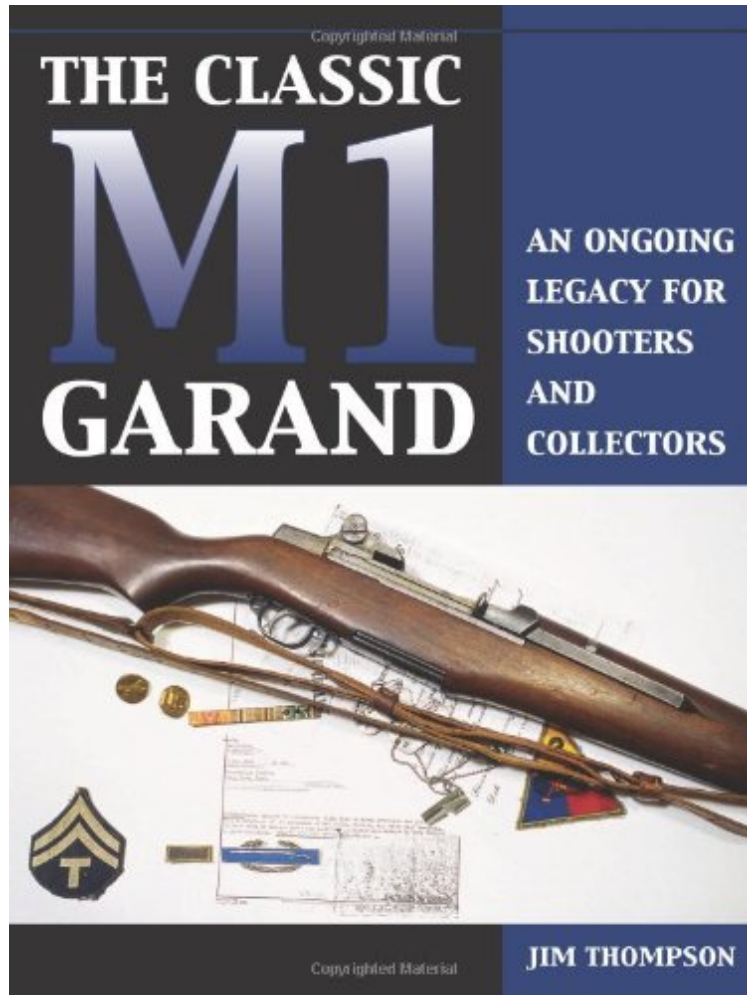

I don't think the book helped me as much as Scott Duff's works have, but in fairness Mr. Thompson specifically made the disclaimer that he wasn't trying to compete with Mr. Duff. That said, the book itself reads more as a conversation with a fellow enthusiast than it does a reference work or a source of technical information for "shooters and collectors." To be sure there is some useful information provided, for

example performing a trigger job or a bolt rebuild/rework. However, the book tends to be more about Mr. Thompson's opinions of the Garand itself (highly complimentary), its suitability for use by the marauding youth gangs in his neighborhood (not so much) and the politics of gun control (vehemently against). In reading it my sense is that the author skips around various subject matters too much with little focus given to any one area. For that matter, the author tends to allude to information that will be covered "later" in the book, but such information doesn't materialize. For example, Mr. Thompson talks about updating handloading information from his earlier book "later" in this volume, but the only discussion is about factory loads. A good editor would have kept Mr. Thompson focused on the subject matter and eliminated contradictions. Overall, I felt as though I was reading a long string of blog posts.
