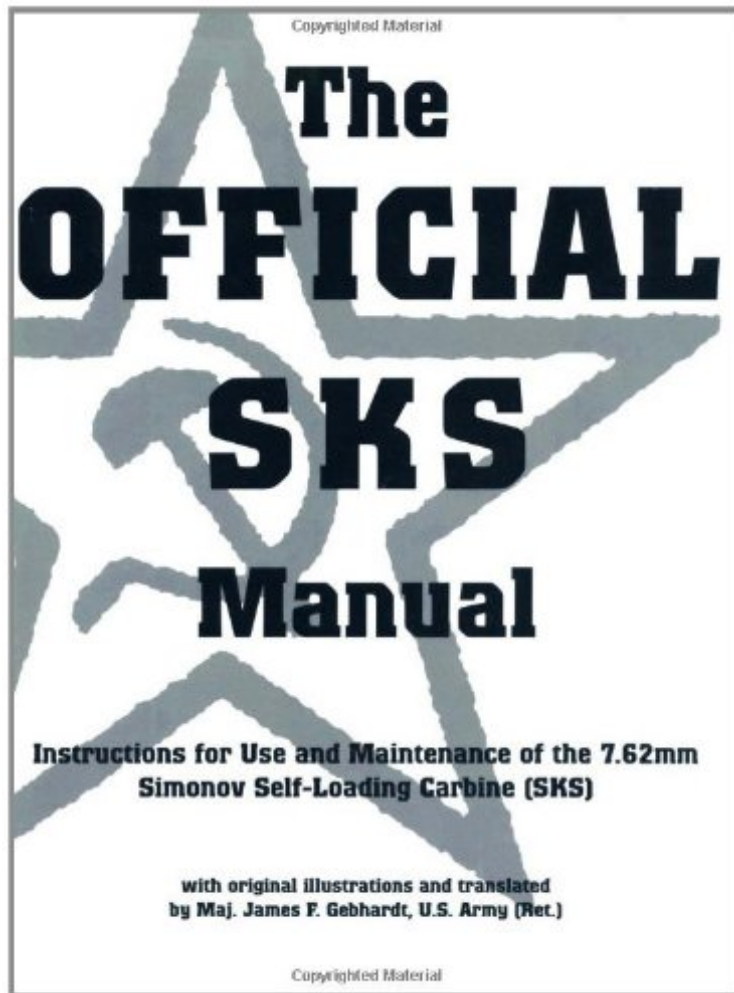

Much of the instruction is verbal, although there are a lot of diagrams and drawings. Nowadays, it's east to get some more detailed maintenance info online to supplement this vintage guide. Still, if you take the time to read this manual you will learn more than you do from the typical modern firearms

instruction sheet you get with a new gun. The illustrations, while being a bit grainy and not always clear, are what you expect from a military field manual from the late 1940s. Besides detailed instructions on disassembly and assembly, cleaning and functioning, it also includes zeroing, shooting and conduct of fire training information. A short history of the weapon is included to round out your basic knowledge base of this robust and ubiquitous rifle.

This Soviet military manual, originally published in the Soviet Union and now available in English for the first time, covers instructions for use and maintenance of perhaps the most widely distributed of all weapons produced by the arms factories of the former Soviet Union: the ubiquitous 7.62mm Simonov self-loading carbine (SKS).

About the Author James F. Gebhardt is a retired U.S. Army officer who served as an enlisted infantryman (1966-69), armor officer (1974-83) and Soviet foreign area officer (1984-91). Gebhardt performed military duty in the Soviet Union and has escorted numerous Soviet scientific, military and diplomatic personnel on U.S. military installations in the United States.
